Thank you to those members of the community who attended the Annual Electors Meeting on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> August.

This year, there were five nominees for five positions vacant and therefore, an election was not required.

Thank you all for accepting your nominations once again and welcome back! Newly elected to the Committee for a two-year term are George Kokar and Sue Oldfield. Welcome George and Sue and thank you for volunteering your time to our Community.

Committee members with another year to serve are Steve Bowley, Ted Buttfeld, Julie Harris, Don McPhee and Graham Newstead.

Margie Dodd and Bruce Meehan have decided not to stand for a position on the Committee this year. The Progress Committee and the Community thank Margie and Bruce for their massive contribution over the years. Not that this means they won't still be volunteering their time to other areas, it's hard to keep good people down!!

Immediately following the Annual Elector's Meeting, a short gathering of the new Committee was held to elect a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson. Don McPhee was returned as Chairperson and Ted Buttfeld as Vice Chairperson. Both of these appointments are for a one-year term.

The bottle and can money, collected from the caravan parks and the cages, has now been distributed. A total of \$4,522.80 was collected this year with the seven participating Community or Sporting groups receiving \$646.11 each for their efforts. ## Progress News Cont...

### Recycling:

NEPRESSO: Many of you will have a Nespresso coffee pod machine at home, in your caravan or holiday home. The used pods are recyclable and the Visitor Centre has a box to put them in. **Only the Nespresso brand pods can be collected for recycling.** The reason for this is that they are made entirely from

Aluminium (unlike some other brands, apparently). You can collect your pods in any sort of container, which can be placed in the box, but when you order or purchase your next coffee pods, check out the recycling bag available from Nespresso.

A reminder that newspapers (dry, flat-packed and tied with string) can be placed in the covered trailer in the Tidy Towns yard adjacent to the Visitor Centre. It is important to recycle as much as we can to reduce the amount of rubbish going into landfill so if you are unable to deliver your papers to the yard please place in your yellow recycling bin.

Stansbury also has a bottle and can recycling depot "Stansbury Recycling" for all your refundable items and glass bottles. Alternatively, they can be placed in the "cages" dotted around town and the blue and yellow bins in the Caravan Parks, the proceeds of which are distributed to those community groups and sporting clubs who participate in the collection.

The Visitor Information Centre has a "Planet Ark" recycling box for all your used printer cartridges as well as a container for recycling the following items:

- The little plastic bread bag sealers
  - Aluminium can pull tabs
  - Plastic screw bottle tops
  - Used biros – no ink
- Colgate items (odd but true!) – empty tubes, boxes, and toothbrushes

## **STANSBURY MUSEUM**

As the new “reporter“ for the museum, I have massive shoes to fill – thank you Ann for your amazing and interesting riddles and articles. I am going to feature something of interest from our fascinating museum each month, starting with 2 volumes which showcase 60 years of Stansbury’s social history.

### **A Photographic Collection of Bride and Bridesmaid Dresses made by the late Doris Vince (1910 -1995) ‘Stansbury’s Own Seamstress’**

Doris was an accomplished seamstress who was renowned for her exquisite work especially for making dresses for local brides, bridesmaids and debutantes. Her family kindly allowed the museum to make a unique photographic record of her work available for all to see.

It is a cavalcade of changing fashions over 60 years and a history of local couples on their wedding days. This collection chronicles the excellent work, skill and long career Doris had as a seamstress.

As you work your way through the folders, you notice changes in wedding dress bridesmaids dress styles, groom’s suits, flowers, veils and trains, hairstyles, and hair accessories, photographic trends, different colours and fabrics and accessories like gloves, hand-bags, horseshoes and buttonholes.

You see very traditional brides in formal settings and brides who expressed their personalities in the choice of colours and themes for their wedding party. Particular favourites of mine are the ‘winter wedding’ theme where the bridesmaids and flower girls wore red dresses and had white fur muffs and white fur trimmed bonnets and the ‘country garden’ theme where the bridesmaids have parasols, wide brimmed hats and shallow baskets cascading with flowers. I was fascinated by the photo of the groomsmen looking very dapper and fashionable wearing pristine, white gloves apparently to cover their rough farmer’s hands. Even the photographic poses are interesting, mostly traditional style formations but one featuring a bride shot seated from behind and looking away to the side, catching her curvaceous figure and the delicate detail on the back of her dress.

We’d love you to come and discover this unique social history for yourself – the folders are located in the Reading Room, so come and browse.

**STANSBURY INSTITUTE MANAGEMENT sub COMMITTEE**  
**ANNUAL REPORT 2019 -2020**

Even though it is normal to have only a few meetings a year, this year there has been less due to the Corona virus. With the restrictions starting in March 2020 and lasting for 3 months it affected the bookings for the regular classes and meetings from all groups. After the lock down was lifted and we had our Covid Plan in place we were able to take bookings, with the restricted numbers and guidelines in place.

The regular patrons were able to resume with the usual activities in early July. The shut down has reduced our finances for the year, by a third. Prior to the shut down we had a variety of extra bookings, such as a wedding, two wedding receptions, funerals, wakes and other functions. When we were allowed to re-open for bookings a junior dance group hired the hall to video their annual concert, without an audience in attendance. Unfortunately the Minlaton Medical Centre no longer holds a weekly clinic, so we have one less regular booking.

The annual contribution from the Yorke Peninsula Council covers any minor maintenance and this allows us to keep our hire costs at a reasonable price. The Institute Committee is a subcommittee of the Stansbury Progress Association and we thank them, for their support.

Over the past 2 years the Yorke Peninsula Council has recommended that the Institute floor be repaired and resurfaced and had put it in their 2020-2021 budget. Unfortunately due to the Corona virus pandemic it was unlikely that the works would be able to go ahead. The Council suggested that if the Institute Committee was prepared to contribute to the costs, the work may be completed in 2020. We decided to contribute and with the same amount contributed from the Stansbury Progress Committee we are hoping that the work will be done during this financial year. We are waiting confirmation of this project starting.

The Committee has done a stock take of all our equipment and some new things have been purchased. With the carpets being cleaned and committee members volunteering the whole premises had a spring clean, prior to the Corona virus restrictions. Rosalie Tresize, continues as the caretaker.

During this year, two former Committee members have passed away, Pauline Jung, our patroness and Kevin O'Shaughnessy, our previous caretaker. We greatly appreciate their many years of service, both serving on the committee and in other areas.

I would personally like to say Thank You to all of the Committee Members for their time and continued support, and offer the incoming committee my congratulations. Your commitment to our town is invaluable.
