## Progress News Cont...

### Recycling:

NEPRESSO: Many of you will have a Nespresso coffee pod machine at home, in your caravan or holiday home. The used pods are recyclable and the Visitor Centre has a box to put them in. **Only the Nespresso brand pods can be collected for recycling.** The reason for this is that they are made entirely from Aluminium (unlike some other brands, apparently). You can collect your pods in any sort of container, which can be placed in the box, but when you order or purchase your next coffee pods, check out the recycling bag available from Nespresso.

The trailer that was available in the yard adjacent to the Visitor Centre has been replaced with a white plastic cube with a metal, lift-up lid. This doesn't have the capacity of the trailer but it is emptied on a regular basis. Should you be unable to place your papers (dry, flat-packed and tied with string) in the container, please report this to the Visitor Centre staff during opening hours or, if the Centre is closed, leave your paper bundles under the shelter. Soft plastics can also be placed in the container, but it is important that these are **clean and appropriately packed**, or this service will be discontinued. It is important to recycle as much as we can to reduce the amount of rubbish going into landfill so if you are unable to deliver your papers to the yard please place in your yellow recycling bin.

Stansbury also has a bottle and can recycling depot "Stansbury Recycling" for all your refundable items and glass bottles. Alternatively, they can be placed in the "cages" dotted around town and the blue and yellow bins in the Caravan Parks, the proceeds of which are distributed to those community groups and sporting clubs who participate in the collection.

The Visitor Information Centre has a "Planet Ark" recycling box for all your used printer cartridges as well as a container for recycling the following items:

- The little plastic bread bag sealers
  - Aluminium can pull tabs
  - **Plastic screw bottle tops – please make sure these are clean as some of them can get a bit "stinky" when sitting around for a while! Also, the tops off medicine bottles are not suitable for this recycling service.**
  - Used biros – no ink
- Colgate items (odd but true!) – empty tubes, boxes, and toothbrushes

COME and EXPLORE SOMETHING of INTEREST for EVERYONE HISTORY COMES  
ALIVE in the OLD SCHOOL

The local primary school children have been doing a project comparing the old and the new. They have visited the museum and have also had a visit from museum volunteer, Susan Hanrahan to assist them research this project. It has been a useful and impressive collaboration between two local institutions who luckily are in close proximity to each other. I thought this month I would continue this theme by doing my own comparison of CFS trucks old and new -timely as the fire season is just starting and no doubt the current truck will once again swing into action when needed. In the 2019/2020 season the Stansbury CFS responded to 33 callouts including the devastating Yorketown fire. I am comparing the CFS truck on display in the museum shed with current CFS trucks -what a difference 60 years makes!

In colonial times, local residents fought fires as they happened, without any formal organisation. By 1913, the state government gave councils the authority to organise fire-fighting and instigate measures to prevent fires and protect property. During WW2 the government established the Emergency Fire Service within the police department to supervise and support council's rural fire fighting work. In 1976 the government passed the Country Fires Act which set up the SA Country Fire Service, our current organisation. The museum CFS appliance is a 1960 4 wheel drive Bedford truck. It was an ex government vehicle that was converted into a modern 1960's fire appliance. It cost \$2180. It has a 670 gallon ( approx 3,000 litres )water tank with a high powered Magurius pump coupled to a 300cu VW industrial engine .

The current 21 year old Stansbury CFS vehicle is a 4 wheel drive Hino Kestrel rural appliance. It has a 2000 litre (approx 440 gallon) tank and also carries 80 litres of bushfire fighting foam which is more effective than just water. The pump is a Darley 1.5 AGE driven by a Kubota D722 liquid cooled motor.

The old CFS truck has an easy access platform built at the rear which allows visitors to the museum to get right up on the back of the vehicle to explore. On the back they will notice the water tank and the pump. There is also a hose reel with a large brass nozzle. Around the edges are plain galvanised iron pipe handrails and also the spotlights are mounted on galvanised pipe. There is a battery operated telephone to link crew on the back with crew in the cabin. On the top of the cabin is a red light that flashes to alert other motorists that the fire appliance is on a call out. The cabin has a front opening window (the only 'air conditioning') . Underneath the chassis in front of each set of wheels are two spray bars that helped to protect the tyres when driving over the fire ground. This was a super modern innovation at the time. This truck was a great improvement on the one used in the 1950's pictured in the museum but compared to the new CFS trucks seems basic in regard to firefighting capability and safety and comfort for the crew.

The current CFS truck has more modern versions of the tank, pump, hoses, flashing light and spotlight. Communication from the crew at the back to those in the cabin is via 2way radio. They are supplied with woolen blankets to use in the event of a burn over and can fit 3crew in the cabin. The latest CFS trucks one of which is on order for our brigade will cost \$350,000 .It will have an air conditioned cabin which can accommodate 6crew. In the event of a burn over, crew can deploy fire curtains, oxygen and a halo spray round the cab. Like their modern counterparts, rural firefighters in days gone by did an amazing job but with much more basic equipment and less attention to their safety.
